10 Must-Know Tips Before You Buy an Antler Wedding Band

1. Know What Antler Rings Are Made Of

Antler rings are crafted using naturally shed deer or elk antlers, often inlaid into durable metals like tungsten, titanium, or Damascus steel. Eco-friendly and cruelty-free? Yes, please.

2. Make Sure It's Sealed

The antler portion should be coated with a high-grade resin for protection. This keeps it from cracking, absorbing water, or getting scratched.

3. Choose the Right Metal Core

- Tungsten: Heavy-duty and scratch-resistant.
- Titanium: Lightweight and hypoallergenic.
- Damascus Steel: Patterned, rugged, and unique.
- Carbon Fiber or Ceramic: Lightweight and modern.

4. Ask If It's Naturally Shed

Reputable jewelers only use antlers that are naturally shed. Always check!

5. Don't Forget Comfort Fit

Rings with a comfort-fit interior feel better for all-day wear—especially if your groom isn't used to wearing jewelry.

6. Think About Customization

Many shops offer engravings or additional inlays like wood, meteorite, or whiskey barrel staves. Make it yours.

7. Price Check Like a Pro

Expect to spend anywhere from \$100 to \$600+, depending on materials, metal, and artistry. Budget for beauty *and* quality.

8. Antler Rings Can't Be Resized

Since they're made with delicate inlays, they usually can't be resized. **Get professionally sized first.**

9. Take Care of It

Avoid water, extreme heat, and rough activities. Clean with a soft cloth and store in a dry, safe spot.

10. Buy From Trusted Artisans

📏 Ring Sizing Tips for Antler Bands

- Get your finger measured at a jeweler—don't guess.
- Order a free ring sizer online if needed.
- Use a wide-band sizing ring for accuracy (antler rings are usually thicker).
- Remember: most can't be resized!
