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☐ Marriage License & IDs
Pack your marriage license and both your photo IDs in your wedding bag now. No license = no legal "I Do." Get a marriage license holder so you don't misplace it!
☐ A Day-Of Contact (That's Not You)
Assign a maid of honor, planner, or trusted friend as your point of contact so you can stay blissfully unaware (and on time).
☐ Meals for Your Vendors
Photographers, planners, musicians — they're working long hours and will need a hot meal. Double-check your catering order includes vendor meals.
☐ The Overnight Bag
Pack <u>comfy shoes or slippers</u> , makeup wipes, change of clothes, <u>cute getaway outfit</u> , snacks, phone charger, all inside a <u>cute duffel or weekender bag</u> .
☐ The Ceremony Decor
Don't forget ceremony essentials like a table for unity candle or sand ceremony, microphone or speaker, reserved seating signs for family.

☐ Vow Copies (Printed or Handwritten)
Bring your vow script, whether printed or handwritten, so you don't forget your words.
☐ Someone to Pack Up at the End

Designate someone to gather leftover <u>favors</u> , guestbook, cake topper, extra programs, bouquet, and card box.
☐ A Rain Plan (Just in Case)
Have a backup plan for outdoor weddings: tent rental, indoor alternative, or <u>clear umbrellas</u> .
☐ A Touch-Up Kit
Include lipstick, deodorant, fashion tape, blotting sheets, safety pins, tampons, tide pen. Bonus: assign your MOH to manage it. Read: <u>20 Things You Must Pack in Your Wedding Bag</u>
\square Cash for Tips
Prepare envelopes with gratuities for hairstylist, officiant, DJ, and delivery drivers. (Not sure who gets a tip? Read our <u>Ultimate Wedding Tipping Guide</u> .)
☐ Breakfast (Seriously, Eat)
Don't forget to eat on your wedding morning. Fuel up with coffee and bagels if possible.
\square A Pair of Backup Shoes
Pack flats or <u>sneakers</u> for comfort after several hours of dancing.
\square A Timeline for the Wedding Party
Print a <u>simple schedule</u> for bridesmaids, groomsmen, and family with key times (arrival, getting dressed, first look, ceremony, reception).
\square Your Ring Cleaner or Wipe
Keep your rings sparkling for close-up photos.
\square Reserved Seats at the Ceremony
Save front row seats for immediate family with reserved signs (<u>these</u> are cheap and go with everything).
☐ Emergency Weather Add-Ons
